*Each of our local parish schools, All Saints Catholic High, St Joseph the Worker and St Laurence's Primary schools are due to return this week. I would like to again thank our three Head Teachers and Governors, the children and their families for all their efforts to keep schools open, despite higher local infection rates in school age children.*

Year 5 children and their households have been invited to attend weekend Masses, *EVERY WEEK*, either Friday night, or Saturday morning, or Saturday evening Masses, as part of the deepening of their faith, before receiving Jesus for the first time in Holy Communion in January 2022. Any Yr5 child baptised in a different parish needs to bring a copy of their baptism certificate to Fr Sean ASAP. All dates of celebrations are now confirmed by this newsletter, for those families who have attended preparation meetings and completed an application form and proof of baptism.

Across England the average Covid infection rate is rising rapidly, with 1 in 25 now carrying the virus to others. **Three injections now seem to protect most people from severe illness, including from the Omicron variant**, but will probably only prevent half of the people from being infected and carrying the infection to others. Other variants can still develop that current vaccines may be less capable of protecting people. Re/infection of people who have been vaccinated is happening and some of these people will be hospitalised. Higher demands for A&E and beds delay ambulances, clinics & operations. Larger crowds in-doors are still riskier. Hence due Caution! The official government guidance for Churches is more complicated than the headlines! Public venue owners still legally need to operate safely.

As the PM and the chief advisors have stated, the pandemic has not disappeared and Liverpool City Region public health advice is that there still needs to be **caution** shown for the on-going risks and to keep social distance, face coverings, working from home if possible and minimising mixing with people you are not usually mixing with; all can be infected, some are still vulnerable and particularly those not yet fully vaccinated, with the risks of long-covid and new variants developing-- with larger numbers of new cases each day creating a risk of residual sources of illness and hospitalisation through the Winter and into next Spring. Knowsley over-12s are currently 69% 2-jabs vaccinated, Liverpool City 64% 2-jabs vaccinated; both these areas are below the national average of 82% for 2-jabs. We see rapidly growing overall infection rates above the national average, people who are currently carrying the virus to those they mix with. With this being the new reality of living-with Covid, **I request that everyone act with GREATER caution when they come to church**; this will also minimise 'track and trace' still instructing people to isolate and test or testing positive and isolating. As Knowsley covid rates are higher, you see adjusted seating capacity in Church to fit more people in, whilst still being spaced out. **PLEASE KEEP MORE SPACED OUT, WITH A TWO BENCH GAP & SPREAD OUT MORE BETWEEN HOUSEHOLD GROUPS.** In these most unusual times, the Church building is still cautiously open for Masses/services, lighting of candles & silent prayer sat in benches before the Blessed Sacrament.

NOW it is still the time to continue to be **cautious**  
Especially with people you don't normally mix with.  
**FACE, SPACE, AND HANDS**

AND good ventilation if meeting inside, is still advised.  
Staying alert, ISOLATING if symptoms or 'Track & Trace' instruct you,  
So as to slow the spread of any infection and new variants,  
to break the chains to other people and still protect the NHS and save lives.

### NATIVITY OCTAVE/TWELVE-DAY FEAST Plus Plus.....

Having spent the four weeks of Advent preparing for the Nativity of the baby Jesus, the Church now gives us more time to celebrate the significance of the feast; eight days are celebrated as if it were Christmas day. New Year's Day in our diaries actually marks the significant 8<sup>th</sup> day on which Mary and Joseph officially give the baby the name they were told to give him by the Angel- 'Jesus', a name which means 'God saves'/saviour. Twelve days to the Epiphany Feast too... more time to deepen our appreciation of the great gift God has sent us! Then the Church offers us more time and we continue the Christmas season, now officially up to the 8<sup>th</sup>/9<sup>th</sup> January and the feast of the Baptism of the adult Jesus.

Even if you normally take down the decorations on Twelfth night, keep your cribs up longer still. Traditionally, the Christmas season used to continue up to the 2<sup>nd</sup> February and the Feast of the Presentation of the baby Jesus in the Temple of Jerusalem; when the Holy Family of Joseph & Mary and the baby Jesus enter the Temple of Jerusalem, the place where God has promised to live in the midst of His people. Jesus, the Word, God-made Flesh and Blood; 'Emmanuel'; a name which means 'God is with us.' Keep your focus on the baby, Jesus.
