At some point in the future, the individual's name will also now be printed on the newsletter for a particular Mass, to show that the Priest is fulfilling his obligation to offer in his own prayers that named person during a particular Mass.

We cannot guarantee that any specific Mass intention will be possible at a particular Mass, on a particular day, but their name will now appear on the parish newsletter up to three times – the week it was handed in, the week of the actual anniversary/birthday and the day the Mass intention is being offered by the priest at Mass. Every Sunday and Holy Days the Parish Priest must also offer one of the Masses for all of his parishioners.

Every Mass is always celebrated for <u>everyone</u>. No-one is forgotten by God, on any day, whether their name is on the newsletter or not and each of us may also be praying for someone else at the same Mass we all attend.

The terrible failure of War is remembered with added poignancy this weekend, as we mark the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Armistice of hostile actions, on the Western Front, the end of the First World War. The fact that this was indeed the first war of global scale, that twenty years later saw its second, ironically emphasised that it was not in fact the 'war to end all wars'. Peace needs justice and justice needs love-in-action to temper the sometimes-harsh edges of our human reactions, that can head towards retribution, or vengeance at its worst. Politics and diplomacy, virtues and conscience all form a complicated jig-saw that lead us to, or prevent War. We pray that today we will remember and learn and act accordingly, to minimise the occasions of violence, in speech, or action.
