<u>WELCOME</u> to everyone at the Masses this weekend and we hold in our prayers anyone who is sick at home, or in hospital, or those caring for the sick, or those whose work-patterns mean they cannot be at Mass this weekend.

If anyone asked us to describe GOD, what would any of us <u>say</u>? God is MORE THAN we can ever hope or imagine; but we try, by putting HUMAN words together into sentences and then explanations are formed and Church teachings formulated over the centuries- these formulations are usually defining the limits to what is acceptable to say or believe to describe God, as a member of the family of the Church. People are free to choose to describe God differently, or beyond those limits, but their choices define them as limiting God. So to say that our God is not the ONE and only God, is not what the Church holds to be true; if I said Jesus was not God or not really human, that is not what the Church holds to be true; if I said the Holy Spirit was just a way of describing a means by which Jesus' teachings are passed on to new generations, but is not God, that is not what the Church holds to be true either. The Church cannot define God in every possible way, because our God is impossible to describe fully enough; but the Church says that God is all loving, all merciful, ever present- all positive, but partial descriptions of our One and Only God. **Fr SEAN**
