In recent class Masses with our children from school, we reminded each other that 'CHURCH' is <u>not</u> the *building*, but Church is the *people* who live with faith each day in the community, loving God, our neighbour and ourselves. Let the children remind us about what is truly important.

In these most unusual times, the <u>Church building will NOT</u> be open even for private prayer and lighting candles, NOW it is STAY at Home and keeping safe 'social distancing' to slow the spread of any infection and break the chain to other people and so save the NHS and save lives.

I will be celebrating Mass ON MY OWN in Church, but I invite those who can, to join me in prayer from their homes, as we offer together our prayers to God, with the sacrifice of Jesus on Calvary at the altar. United in prayer, we receive communion in our hearts, even when not on our tongue or our hands.

# I will celebrate Mass each evening at 6.30pm Monday to Friday & now CHANGED to 10am on both Saturday and Sundays.

I have made a temporary repair to our Church bell and recommenced ringing the bell each day at **12 Noon and 6pm EVERY day.** At these times I invite everyone at home to pray the 'Angelus' prayer, printed over the page, which following the Feast of the Annunciation last week reminds us of, the Angel's Prayer to Mary, the Hail Mary prayer of St Elizabeth and indeed the prayer of life and death During the day *consider praying the 'Rosary'*, the life of Jesus, with Mary and Joseph. 1 X 'Our Father' and 10 X 'Hail Mary', 1X'Glory be' for each of the 5 mysteries Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful, Glorious...Carefully and safely I place a candle in the window of the Presbytery house to show Christ our Light into the darkness of the streets: from 7pm each evening. 'Clap and cheer for the Carers', Thursday evenings at 8pm, (join me at your front door or window after our 'Stations of the Cross' @ 7pm)

The Liturgical Cycle. The Church's year has a rhythm which reflects God's relationship with his People. We are coming up to the most important feasts of the year, beginning NEXT Sunday, Palm Sunday - Holy Week and the Thursday Sacred Triduum, the three-day Feast of the Lord's Passion, Death and Resurrection to the Easter Day. While we cannot celebrate this together in our churches, we can try to reflect on it at home through prayer, reading and using the various electronic means at our disposal. The following resources are just a few suggestions:

- Go to the Archdiocesan website <u>www.liverpoolcatholic.org.uk</u> and follow the link to Streamed-Masses and other useful information.
- As access to our churches is not possible, the weekly newsletter will continue to be created and can be accessed on the primary school websites.
- There is a website, <u>Universalis</u>, which gives the Mass reading for each day.
- 'The daily Prayer of the Church are a good way of keeping the rhythm of the Church's prayer. During this time the publication 'Magnificat' is also now available online free of charge. Go to www.magnificat.com

Can I also encourage people at home to find and read from the Old Testament of the Bible, from the book of **EXODUS**; this re-tells the story of the Jewish slaves of Egypt and their first Passover Feast, their camps of family tents and journey in the desert and the Tent of Meeting, where Moses & God speak, whilst the people stood at the door of their family tents at the same time; their prayers to God united with Moses'. For Christians, Jesus is the New Moses and more than that He is God-made-Flesh-and-Blood and He is the Sacrifice, whose Blood is shed to take away the sins of the People and who removes the veil of the Temple Tent of Meeting, & all that separates us and brings us in truth and fact face-to-face with God the Father, through the working of the Holy Spirit. Those we can see and those we cannot see, all joined in Jesus, through the Spirit, with our loving heavenly Father and with each other.
