Dear Families,

In these strange times, we have all been asked to follow the UK government advice to respond to and reduce the harm to other people caused by the spread of the new Coronavirus, Covid-19.

The government advice now leads to the next steps for schools and Churches. The Head-teacher will inform families in relation to how schools are affected, I am writing to explain what is happening with Churches, Masses and the sacraments of the Church.

From Friday evening St Joseph & St Laurence's Parish <u>Church will continue to remain open</u>, every weekday from 8.30am until 3.30pm and weekends from 10am until 1pm. Everyone is **WELCOME** to visit Church during these times for personal prayers, lighting of candles and prayer before Jesus, the Blessed Sacrament (communion) in the Tabernacle at the altar.

However, from **THIS** weekend there will be no public gatherings in groups or congregations and all Church services are cancelled, until we are next allowed to gather together in groups. This is to minimise passing on the virus by human contact; these steps increase 'social distancing', by reducing the number of people any of us has closer contact with and by breaking the chain of infection so as not to pass it to those who may be more vulnerable to the effects of the virus- like those over 70 years old, those who are pregnant and those with underlying serious health conditions.

Because of these new restrictions to public gatherings there will therefore NOT be any Masses to attend and all parish meetings for groups or sets of children will also be <u>postponed</u> until we are able to gather together again in public events.

I <u>will</u> be celebrating Mass every day for all the people of the parish during this health emergency and the bishops of England and Wales invite parishioners at home every day to join their prayers with the priest's prayers and the offering of the Mass and the sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross at the altar and so receive Communion in their hearts, even if now they can't on their tongues or hands.

Mass sheets with the Sunday Mass readings and prayers will be available at the back of Church each weekend to take home and pray together as a family and individually at home.

Weekly parish newsletters, with updates and information will also be printed each weekend for people to collect from the back of Church.

Year 4 First reconciliations and their receiving of Holy Communion at a Sunday Mass for the first time will be <u>postponed</u>, until after meetings are rearranged, and public gatherings are restarted.

There are also a lot of on-line facilities for Church information, updates and daily Mass and prayers and streamed Masses are also available around the Country and including with the Pope in the Vatican
