Dear Parents,

On 1 January 2022 Knowsley officially became the Liverpool City Region Borough of Culture and launched an exciting year-long programme of events. To start the year, Knowsley is hosting a series of dramatic lighting installations across the borough. The programme, entitled 'A New Dawn', will include spectacular 'moments of light' as well as the illumination of town centres, public buildings and landmarks. Here's what to expect from Knowsley's illuminating start to the year:

Aqualux–14 to 28 Jan –Kirkby town centre

Aqualux is a stunning light installation that will be situated in the town centre for two weeks. The artwork consists of 48 containers which can hold up to 1,000 litres of water – the average consumption of a



household over a year. Coming to life after dark. the artwork will be accompanied by music to create a memorable and magical experience while raising awareness of the need to conserve and

protect our fragile water supplies. The Magic Wood – 21, 22 and 23 Jan 2022 – Halewood

Court Farm Woods in Halewood will be transformed into an enchanted spectacle of light, music and fiery woodland creatures.

Gaia – 28 Jan to 17 Feb – St. Chad's Church Luke Jerram's 'Gaia' is an astonishing 6metre-wide replica of the earth based on imagery and data from NASA. Suspended in the air and slowly revolving, the artwork



gives people a chance to see the planet, floating in three dimensions.

Tall Tales – 4 and 5 Feb 2022 – Stockbridge Village

Tall Tales is a brand-new community artwork that will see a residential 16 storey tower animated and illuminated in light. The dramatic projection will be accompanied by a soundtrack, will tell the story of local communities who have shared their stories, memories, hopes and dreams about the place they call home.

Submergence – 12 to 26 Feb – Huyton Village Centre

Submergence is a reflective, immersive walkthrough experience that will go on display in Sherbourne Square in Huyton Village. Consisting of thousands of individual points of suspended light, visitors are encouraged to enter the artwork to experience the amazing light illusion for themselves.

New Dawn Light Spectacular – 18 and 19 February – Knowsley Hall

The programme will come to a spectacular climax in February. Knowsley Hall will be illuminated in a series of projections recreating a



vision of a pop-up story book – a fairy-tale of lights and sound telling the stories of Knowsley.

All of these events will be free for the public to attend (although some will require tickets to be reserved in advance).

When the installation opens our Y2, Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6 classes will be going to the Church to see it. The Artwork will enhance the work they are doing in class in Geography & Design Technology.

Kirkby Gallery

Our local gallery currently has the most wonderful exhibition of the original work of Quentin Blake. Kirkby Gallery is the first venue to host the exhibition on its national tour. Some of his most famous collaborations with authors have been on poetry, from illustrating the hilarious verses of Michael Rosen to the gruesome rhymes of Roald Dahl. Our KS2 classes will all be visiting the exhibition after half term and have the opportunity to create their own characters inspired by this superb artist and illustrator.

Head Lice

We have been informed of a couple of cases of Head lice within school. Please check your child's hair and treat them if necessary. Head lice infection may spread if individual parents/carers fail to treat their children.

Health education about head lice encourages parents/carers and children to:

• Prevent head lice by regular shampooing, conditioning and daily combing of the hair.

• Detect head lice using a fine-tooth plastic or detector comb on a weekly basis. (we have these in school if needed, just ask at the school office)

• Treat head lice as soon as an infection becomes apparent.

If your child does need treatment, it is advisable to check ALL other family members also. Please remember that whether the wet combing method or insecticide lotion/shampoo method is used, evidence of head lice AND eggs must be physically removed from the hair. To help stop the spread of Head lice all hair below shoulder length should be tied back, whilst your child is at school.
