Across England the average Covid infection rate remains high and rising, with 1in 40 now carrying the virus to others. Three injections now seem to protect most people from severe illness, including from the now multiple Omicron variants. However, a number of those who do get infected are re-infections, and Omicron seems to be able to infect vaccinated people more easily than other variants, but still affecting people less severely when vaccinated; all still then need to isolate and potentially have long covid symptoms and health consequences. Numbers are still affecting hospitals, although the vaccination is working to reduce the severity of the cases for most people. Other variants will still develop. Fourth, boosters are now offered to the over 75s and those most vulnerable. For some, the demands for A&E and beds will delay ambulances, clinics & operations. Larger crowds in-doors are still riskier. Public venue owners still legally need to operate safely.

In these unusual times, the <u>Church building is still cautiously open</u>: Masses, lighting of candles, silent prayer in benches before the Blessed Sacrament.

NOW it is still the time to continue to be **cautious**,
Especially with people you don't normally mix with,
recognising those who are still more vulnerable.
AND good ventilation if meeting inside, is still advised.
Staying alert, ISOLATING if have symptoms, to break the chains to other people and protect the NHS from the additional pressures and save lives.

This week sees the celebration of both local martyrs for the faith and those from abroad; each link us together into the Catholic family of faith for all time and all generations. From the earliest decades after Jesus' death and resurrection belief in Jesus was risky to anyone's life, as persecutions began almost immediately against the followers of 'The Way'. As the faith spread from East to West the development and deepening of the understanding of the Church about who Jesus Christ truly is and why that makes Him unique in the whole story of salvation, triggered new arguments and disputes until they were formally discussed and clarified and defined/finalised, as sufficiently as possible, to adequately avoid misrepresenting the teachings of the Church.

This was part of defining not the 'answers to everything', but the limits to what we can say while still be teaching the same faith- so for example we are free to say Jesus was a good person, but if we said, 'but he was <u>only</u> human', that would not sufficiently describe who Jesus truly is. In limiting Jesus to just human, we miss that he is infact **also** Divine. No-one can describe and explain the faith clearly enough, but there are limits beyond which we are saying something that isn't consistent with the Catholic Faith and teachings. It can be a tricky debate to be had, but whilst this and other teachings of the Church sometimes develop as human language and knowledge changes, the essential truths remain from the beginning, from those earliest times to those of the later martyrs for the faith; whilst developing and deepening our understanding for the search for the deeper and deepest Truths for each new generation.
