Across England the average Covid infection rate remains high and rising, with 1 in 30 now carrying the virus to others. Three injections now seem to protect most people from severe illness, including from the now multiple Omicron variants. However, a number of those who do get infected are re-infections, and Omicron seems to be able to infect vaccinated people more easily than other variants, but still affecting people less severely when vaccinated; all still then need to isolate and potentially have long covid symptoms and health consequences. Numbers are still affecting hospitals, although the vaccination is working to reduce the severity of the cases for most people. Other variants will still develop. Fourth, boosters are now offered to the over 75s and those most vulnerable. For some, the demands for A&E and beds will delay ambulances, clinics & operations. Larger crowds in-doors are still riskier. Public venue owners still legally need to operate safely. In these still unusual times, the Church building is still cautiously open: Masses, lighting of candles, silent prayer in benches before the Blessed Sacrament.

NOW it is still the time to continue to be **cautious**, Especially with people you don't normally mix with, recognising those who are still more vulnerable.

Good ventilation if meeting inside

& face-coverings again, in very crowded spaces, are both still advised. Staying alert, ISOLATING if have symptoms, to break the chains to other people and protect the NHS from the additional pressures and save lives.

The months are rattling away and, depending how you plan your lives, it is either, just gone past the half-year point or, we have completed the first quarter of the respective current year. There are also the seasonal divides in the twelve month calendar, as the moon circles around the earth, as we circle around the sun and as our solar system circles the sweep of the Milky Way, within the wider, expanding universe......and here we are, little, insignificant creatures, who disappear into infinity, within the vastness of the created world; matter and dark matter, 'seen and unseen' elements, atoms and chemical and electrical reactions and interactions......

And yet, with all this knowledge and wisdom and science and observation we are left with the biggest questions of life and how to try to view our lives as God sees us. Infinitely precious individuals who are more important than we can hope or imagine to the loving gaze of our Heavenly Father.

The Archbishop confirmed some of our High School Children in All Saints Catholic High School last Wednesday and he described the sacrament as a special time when God is wanting to share His life with us. God is bigger, better, brighter, more forgiving, more loving than that we can hope or imagine. Bigger, wider, higher, deeper than the whole expanding Universe that He created, from the beginning. Before that, God existed and then, He wanted to share His life with us: 'Let there be light! And there was Light!' The Big Bang.
