Please join in prayer with the Holy Spirit, for the success of the Archdiocesan Pastoral Plan

During September I will be looking for volunteers for various roles in the parish. After the restrictions of Covid and the changes that have affected so many parishioners, we will start afresh and look for expressions of interest, for people to respond to and then be considered, before commencing in these roles.

Across England the average Covid infection rate remains high, with 1in 60 now carrying the virus to others. Three injections now seem to protect most people from severe illness, including from the now multiple Omicron variants. However, a number of those who do get infected are reinfections, and Omicrons seems to be able to infect vaccinated people more easily than other earlier variants, but still affecting less severely those people who are fully vaccinated; all still then need to isolate and potentially have long covid symptoms and health consequences. Numbers are still affecting hospitals, although the vaccination is working to reduce the severity of the cases for most people. Other variants will still develop. Fourth, boosters are now offered to the over 75s and those most vulnerable and to the over 50s from September . For some, the demands for A&E and beds will delay ambulances, clinics & operations and worsen the speed & level of treatment. Larger crowds in-doors are still riskier. Public venue owners still legally need to operate safely. In these still unusual times, the Church building is still cautiously open: Masses, lighting of candles, silent prayer in benches before the Blessed Sacrament.

NOW it is still the time to continue to be **cautious**, with people you don't normally mix with, recognising those who are still more vulnerable.

Good ventilation if meeting inside

& Face-coverings again, in very crowded spaces, are both still advised. Staying alert, ISOLATING if have symptoms, to break the chains to other people and protect the NHS from the additional pressures and save lives.

The death of someone of such significance as the Queen stirs up many emotions. A wonderful national leader, dedicated to service for over 70 years is quite an example to all of us. It also stirs up memories of our own family histories, intertwined with the Queen's and the Royal family over the generations. Some have expressed their surprise at their personal feelings of loss, perhaps despite their views on Monarchy. That said, Queen Elizabeth II has led a remarkable life of faith-filled service to God and her people of this country and across the seas and the Commonwealth of Nations, for which we give praise and thanks to God, as we pray for her on this her final journey back to the God who loves her and back to Prince Philip and all her loved ones who have gone before us; like for all our loved ones who have died.

Some of the relics of St Bernadette's body are being brought to England. The idea of relics is to help us reflect upon the life of the person who is a saint and be physically closer to their mortal remains, like when we visit their grave or Garden of Remembrance. There is a religious, devotional, spiritual benefit of such times of prayer and many graces and blessings to be received. For those who have been to Lourdes, or those who haven't, there is an opportunity to visit her relics at the Cathedral over the weekend of the 17th/18th/19th September. There is a FREE coach trip to the Cathedral on the Saturday, 17th September leaving Church at 2pm. We'll make the afternoon and evening into a parish day, by returning for our 6pm evening Mass in the parish and then join a parish social in the club, with FREE buffet and entertainment, and to also thank our seminarian, James Finnigan, who will by then be about to complete his time with us, before returning to Seminary at the end of September.
