Across England the average Covid infection rate is rising, with 1 in 35 now carrying the virus to others. **On-going booster injections seem to protect most people from severe illness, including from the now multiple Omicron variants. However, a number of those who do get infected are re-infections, and Omicrons seem to be able to infect vaccinated people, but still affecting those people who are fully vaccinated less severely; all still then need to isolate if infected and all potentially have long covid symptoms and health consequences.** Numbers are still affecting hospitals, although the vaccination is working to reduce the severity of the cases for most people. Other variants will still develop. Fourth, boosters are now offered to the over 50s and those most vulnerable. For some, the demands for A&E and beds will delay ambulances, clinics & operations and worsen the speed & level of treatment available. Larger crowds in-doors are still riskier, as is mixing with the elderly whilst infected. Public venue owners still legally need to operate safely. In these still unusual times, the Church building is still open: Masses, lighting of candles, silent prayer in benches before the Blessed Sacrament.

NOW it is still the time to continue to be **cautious**,
with people you don't normally mix with,
especially with those who are elderly and those more vulnerable.

Good ventilation if meeting inside & Face-coverings,
are both still advised with the elderly & most vulnerable.
Staying alert, ISOLATING if have symptoms, to break the chains to other
people and protect the NHS from the additional pressures and save lives.

October is a month dedicated to Our Lady, Mary, the Mother of God. Public Rosary, reflecting upon the mysteries of our faith in Jesus Christ, is said before the 11am Sunday Morning Mass each weekend, as we continue to pray for peace in Ukraine and throughout the world. A separate reminder, that our Church is open during most of the day, Monday to Saturday, 8am 'til 4pm, and later if there is evening Mass, (8am 'til 1pm Sundays) so please pop in to 'pay a visit' to the Blessed Sacrament in the Tabernacle and to light candles. Also think about coming to a weekday Mass as well as a Sunday Mass, as another way of deepening devotion to the Word of God proclaimed and the Word made into Flesh, the Blessed Sacrament, Holy Communion.

Application forms to attend Catholic Schools~:

It is that time of year again when Primary Schools and High Schools application forms start to become available. Each school has its own admissions forms that must be completed and returned to each school. Parents ALSO need to complete Knowsley Council's on-line application forms for schools. The school admissions criteria, the geographical parish boundary families live within and whether a child is a baptised Catholic at the time of the Council deadline dates, are all important facts that families need to be aware of and ensure they comply with, to be considered by each schools' Governing Body, for a place for their child at any Catholic School.
