Across England the average Covid infection rate is still rising with people still carrying the virus to others. **On-going booster injections seem to protect most people from severe illness, including from the now multiple Omicron variants.** Numbers of infections are now affecting hospitals again, although the vaccinations are working to reduce the severity of the cases for most people. For some time, the demands for A&E and beds will delay ambulances, clinics & operations and worsen the speed & level of treatment available. 1 in 30 are suffering from long-covid conditions after being infected by the virus. Larger crowds in-doors are still riskier, as is mixing with the elderly & those most vulnerable whilst infected. In these still unusual times, the <u>Church building is still open</u>: Masses, lighting of candles, silent prayer in benches before the Blessed Sacrament.

Some may still wish to continue to wear face masks in Church.

The Bishops' Independent Review of Safeguarding in England & Wales & the ICSA reports: The published national inquiry ICSA report into the crimes and sins of abuse across many organisations, including the Catholic Church, has highlighted historic cases over the last fifty years and recent examples. It and a separate report have recommended further reforms to the Church's safeguarding processes and to address the victims & survivors needs. All our bishops have accepted the recommendations and committed to constantly further improve safeguarding & support throughout Church & society and this continues to be something that has to be continuously prioritised.

With Covid guidance still in place for visiting the elderly and vulnerable and with the need for Eucharistic Ministers to have their DBS checks renewed, we currently cannot normally provide communion visits at home. If a parishioner is ill in hospital, please ask family to inform nursing staff that they are Catholic and wish to be seen by a Catholic Chaplain on their ward.

If parishioners <u>are sick at home and their condition is likely to get worse</u>, please telephone the presbytery and Fr Sean will arrange a visit for the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion.

Fr Sean is the Catholic Chaplain to Alder Hey Children's Hospital.

The central heating is on in church <u>two hours before</u> each Mass or service each day, so anyone is welcome to come to sit in Church at those times, to be 'warm and cosy' here then, as well as during and after Masses.

A WARM WELCOME to everyone at Mass this week. The gift of God keeps on giving! God's WORD and the gift of Jesus' Body & Blood, Holy Communion, each give us strength to live our lives each day with Faith, Hope & Love. World events don't stop for Ramadan, Passover or Easter Feasts and why would they? The news continues to highlight the hot spots of wars, violence, famine, and floods. Nothing has apparently changed since the beginning of time. But, after all the preparation and commemorations, we have been moved by and through the real-life story of one human being, Jesus, whose life, struggles, passion and death has **changed** the world- whilst the world still slept or carried on its normal business of the day.

Dead and buried, and very early in the morning on the third day since Jesus was crucified, early before the sun rose, His grieving disciples go to the tomb, to show respect for the dead body of the One whom they have loved. But, the stone has been rolled away from the entrance and tomb is empty. Has someone now stolen His dead body too? These same disciples and the 11 Apostles then begin to meet the Risen Jesus; He is Alive again! He is Risen! Alleluia! Alleluia! It is quite a day! The world HAS been changed forever. Death is now NOT the end of our life's journey and there will be reunion with our loved ones again. Today, Sunday, is the 'eighth day' and we celebrate the occasion the Risen Jesus appears again in the Upper Room, on the eighth day since his resurrection.

But, we may not personally feel that at the moment, as the world events continue to unfold about us and with our own griefs and struggles, we may feel stuck, perhaps more like Good Friday than Easter Day emotions in our heads and hearts. That is OK too. Whether it's a mix of Good Friday, or Easter Day feelings now, it will **change** and be Easter for All, in the end. **FR SEAN**
