Prayer to God the Holy Spirit

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created.

‘Encourage and invite someone back to Church’: People, for various reasons, stopped regularly attending Mass and post-covid restrictions some people also may feel it is difficult to re-start. No-one needs to worry about having been absent from Church for a while. Everyone is WELCOME! It might just take a word of encouragement from you. Please ask a friend or relative to come with you to Church next Sunday.

More than 600,000 people obtain legal visas to travel to work in the UK because we are short of local staff. They then pay UK taxes and work to support our public services like the NHS, schools, and social care etc. At most, 60,000 people may travel over the channel this year in dangerous dingys organised by criminal gangs who charge thousands of pounds from them and end up risking their lives at sea. The majority of these qualify as asylum seekers fleeing war and persecution, but they are not allowed to work in this country, pending UK asylum decisions that drag on for years, which lead to emergency accommodation demands in hotels. It is complicated and a difficult issue to deal with. However, why not give these same people who qualify as asylum seekers in Europe UK visas and bring them here in government ferries? Get the workers and more taxpayers. Destroy the people-trafficker gangs’ businesses and save the vulnerable ??Better??

With Covid still around (Week 184 of Covid-19 UK guidance) the visiting of the elderly and vulnerable and the need for new Eucharistic Ministers to have DBS checks, means we currently cannot normally provide communion visits at home. If a parishioner is ill in hospital, please ask family to inform nursing staff that they are Catholic and wish to be seen by a Catholic Chaplain on their ward.

If parishioners are sick at home and their condition is likely to continue to limit their daily life, please telephone the presbytery and Fr Sean will arrange a visit for the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion.

A WARM WELCOME to everyone at Church this week.

We gather here with terror-violence against Israel, followed by attacks on the Gaza Strip and the wider political effect upon the wider world more uncertain.

Pope Francis has the worldwide gathering of the current Synod of Bishops in Rome meeting to listen to the call of the Holy Spirit to help us listen and discern how we are being called by God to serve the world with the message of the Good News of Jesus Christ; a first century Jewish Teacher in then Roman-occupied Palestine. A weak human revealing God’s presence.

We gather in Kirkby, as Christian followers of Jesus in a much-divided world, searching for peace in peoples’ hearts and lives in a complex world.

After the fighting is paused people have to meet to talk and listen and it is only then that the path to peace and justice can be discovered and achieved.

Application forms to attend Catholic High Schools~:

It is that time of year again when High Schools application forms start to become available. Each school has its own admissions ‘SIF forms’ that must be completed and returned to each school. Write on the ‘SIF forms’ if the child is a baptised Catholic. Parents ALSO need to complete Knowsley Council’s on-line application form for schools. The school admissions criteria, the geographical parish boundary families live within and whether a child is a baptised Catholic at the time of the Council admissions deadline dates, are all important facts that families need to be aware of and ensure they comply with, to be considered by each schools’ Governing Body, for a place for their child at any Catholic School. **If the completed ‘SIF’ form is not returned to schools, the child will not be processed as a ‘Catholic Child’.**
